Marguerite Rizzo

As Keynote Speaker

Marguerite Rizzo is currently assigned as the Deputy-In-Charge of the Forensic Science Section at the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office. Rizzo has been a Deputy District Attorney since 1999.

Before joining the District Attorney's Office, Rizzo spent approximately 10 years working in the fields of microbiology and molecular biology. Rizzo received a B.S. in medical laboratory science from Northeastern University and an M.A. in microbiology from Boston University. Rizzo was a clinical microbiologist at the New England Deaconess Hospital in Boston and a research scientist at Schering-Plough Corporation in New Jersey. After relocating to California, Rizzo became a research scientist at Stanford University in the Department of Developmental Biology, and later at the University of California, Los Angeles, in the Department of Chemistry & Biochemistry.

Rizzo co-prosecuted the capital case of serial killer Lonnie Franklin Jr., aka "the Grim Sleeper." Franklin's case was the first successful use in California of "Familial Searching" of a DNA database to identify a criminal suspect.

In her role as DIC of the Forensic Science Section at the District Attorney's Office, Rizzo acts a forensic science liaison with law enforcement agencies throughout the county as well as the crime laboratories. Rizzo frequently conducts office wide training related to DNA and other forensic science disciplines. Additionally, Rizzo is a member of local, state, and national Forensic Science committees which address topical issues related to the changing landscape of forensic science.



Now Starring...

Amy Holliday

As Keynote Speaker

Amy Holliday joined the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office in 2002 following four years in civil practice. She has completed assignments in Misdemeanors, Juvenile Hall, Domestic Violence, Felony Teams, Career Criminal Prosecution, Felony Team Lead, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution, and Homicides. Amy first began supervising in 2015. She spent nearly four years as the supervisor of the Misdemeanor Unit.

Notable cases Amy prosecuted include the case against former Sacramento Police Department Officer Gary Baker, who preyed on an elderly victim suffering from speech aphasia and sexually assaulted her on three occasions. When the East Area Rapist/Golden State Killer was arrested in 2018, Amy moved back to Homicides as one half of the team that prosecuted Joseph James DeAngelo for the crimes he committed in Sacramento and five other counties in the 1970's and 1980's. Amy also prosecuted the 27-year-old series of sexual assaults against Mark Manteuffel.

In 2014, Amy received the Outstanding Victim Service Award and in 2015, Amy was awarded the Brian L. Hintz Prosecutor of the Year Award.

Outside of the office, Amy is an attorney coach for the Saint Francis High School mock trial team. Amy is also an instructor for the Institute of Criminal Investigation and teaches Trial Advocacy at Lincoln Law School in Sacramento. Amy has a passion for working with victims of crime, especially those who are particularly vulnerable.

Shaun McGovern

As Keynote Speaker

Shaun McGovern started his career in 2005, as a Community Service Officer, with the Sacramento Police Department. In 2007, Shaun was promoted to Police Officer and assigned to the Patrol Division. Detective McGovern worked his way to the Crime Suppression Unit and in 2015 Detective McGovern aided in the development of the Marijuana Enforcement Team. Shaun was promoted to detective in 2017 and assigned to the Sexual Assault and Child Abuse Unit.

During 2018, Detective McGovern was a member of the investigative team that used investigative genetic genealogy to identify and arrest Roy Charles Waller (NorCal Rapist) for the more than ten sexual assault and kidnappings he committed between 1991 and 2006.

In 2019, Detective McGovern was the lead investigator for the People V. John Doe DNA Warrant case, which used investigative genetic genealogy to identify and arrest Mark Jeffrey Manteuffel for three violent sexual assaults he committed between 1992 and 1994.

At the beginning of 2020, Detective McGovern was honored to be awarded the Sacramento District Attorney's Office Rebecca Moore Award for Performance, Passion, Integrity, and Commitment to the Preparation and Prosecution of Sexual Assault Cases.

Since February of 2021, Detective McGovern has been assigned to the Major Crimes Division, Homicide Unit.

Walking Directions from The Lodge.

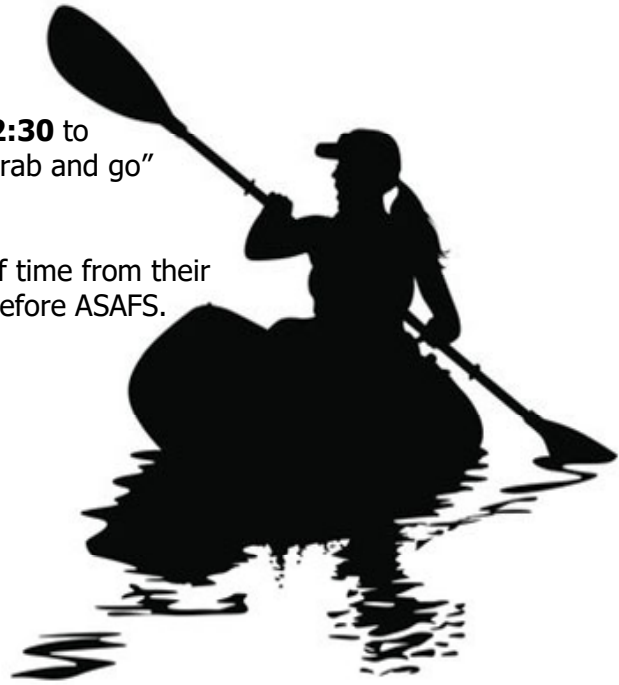

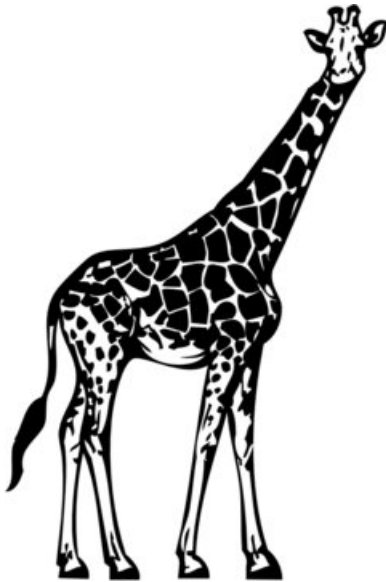

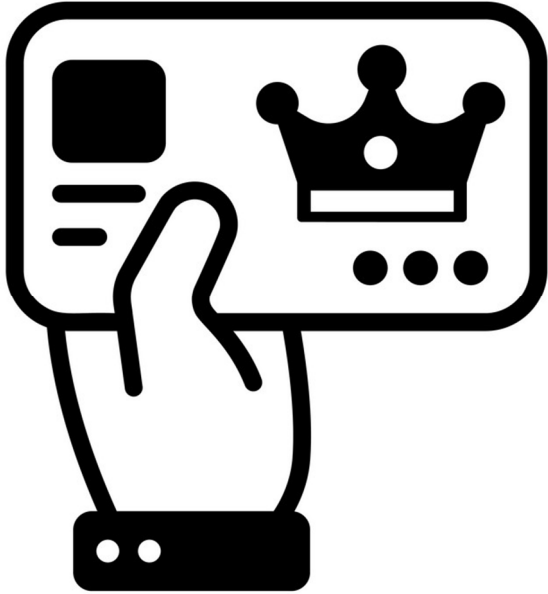
